"All Schools Mass," a traditional event during Catholic Schools Week, was hosted by St. Anthony High School on Wednesday, January 30, in the St. Anthony High School gym. Over 900 students from Sacred Heart Grade School, St. Michael Grade School in Sigel, St. Thomas Grade School in Newton, St. Anthony Grade School, and St. Anthony High School were in attendance. Rev. David Hoefler celebrated Mass while Rev. Brian Alford, Rev. Albert Allen, and Rev. Sunder Ery concelebrated.

Following "All Schools Mass," St. Anthony High School hosted "Experience Catholic High School Day." Fifth through eighth grade students from Sacred Heart and St. Anthony Grade Schools enjoyed the day by participat-



ing in a rotation of activities led by St. Anthony High School students and faculty. Activities included Minute to Win It games, gym activities, and building ice cream sundaes.

Students also experienced team building exercises, Catholic Scholar Bowl, and a science show from Mr. Science Teacher, SAHS's Mr. Matt Poston.


