

2015 St. Anthony Graduates Post Record High ACT Scores

We are excited to announce that the 2015 St. Anthony High School graduating class posted the highest ACT composite score in the school's history. The results of ACT scores taken by St. Anthony High School students who graduated in 2015 earned an average composite score of 24.9, which is 4.2 points higher than the State of Illinois' average composite score of 20.7. The highest average composite score at St. Anthony High School prior to this year was 24.8.





"These results absolutely reflect the dedication of both our students and teachers," said Principal Greg Fearday. "Our students take their coursework very seriously, and our teachers prepare to challenge their students everyday."

According to the report, St. Anthony High School students scored above the state average in each category, including the following scores: 24.2 for St. Anthony in English, compared to 20.3 for the state; 26.1 in mathematics, compared to 20.7; 24.0 in reading, compared to 20.8; and 24.8 in science, compared to 20.6.

"Our administration, teachers and support staff work hard to create a positive learning environment in which our students thrive," said Fearday. "We will continue to work as a team with our students and their parents to ensure our students are getting a solid education foundation that will allow them continued success in their academics."

St. Anthony Schools are Catholic, co-educational schools that provide a learning environment steeped in tradition and committed to excellence in education. Founded by St. Anthony's parish and originally ran by the School Sisters of Notre Dame, the school system offers a comprehensive curriculum where students are encouraged to discover and develop their individual talents and potential, while confirming values and living in faith.


NEWS & UPDATES

The team won its tenth consecutive regional title but saw its streak of nine consecutive state final appearances end as they fell one stroke short at sectionals, placing fourth. Everyone on Coach Eric Zeller's team saw marked improvement throughout the season.

On the boys' side, our only returning runner from the previous season, Clayton Helmink, ran number 1 position consistently throughout the year, dropping 1:37 off his time from the first to last meet.

On the girls' side, we returned several runners and had many first timers join us this season. Anna Sophia Keller continued her domination of central Illinois XC, winning every meet she entered and dropping 1:20 off her time from first to last meet. Freshman Abby Weis consistently ran in the number 2 position dropping 2:36 off her time.

BASEBALL: Coach Kenny Koenig's baseball team finished the season 13-8, ending in a 3- game winning streak to win the NTC Tournament. Three players, Drew Gibson, Bryar Jansen, and Greg Utz made the all-conference team.

GIRLS TENNIS: The girls tennis team, coached by Darlene Esker, has completed its season. The #1 singles player was sophomore Claire Wortman and the #1 doubles team was juniors Kelly Rentfrow and Mary Claire Wegman.

VOLLEYBALL: Coach Kristie Bailey's volleyball team is winding down its season. They finished third in the NTC tournament. Coach Bailey stated that they are a hard working and wonderful group of girls to coach. Good luck to seniors Aly Esker, Isabel Moore, and Raven Rincker!

SOCCER: Bulldog Soccer has exploded! Coach Eric Morales' soccer team finished the season with many accomplishments, records, and titles. Best season-ending record: 21-3-1; most goals scored in a single season: 72; highest % of matches won: 86%; fewest losses in a season: 3; most matches played in a single season: 25; only team to win Bulldog invitational back-to-back.

Other exciting facts: We went 8-0 at home, and no team scored on us on our home field. We had 19 shutouts in 25 games, and hold the lowest % of matches lost. We won the Bulldog 8-team Invitational in August, we got 2nd at the Mattoon Soccer Invite in October, we won regional championship, and made it to the Sweet 16 sectional championship game where we lost in double overtime/penalty kick shootout 2-1.

Five players were named to the All Area 1st Team (Ryan Kruger, James Kabbes, Kyle Hartke, Nick Grunloh, and Ian Harris) and five players to the All Area 2nd Team (Donovan Hammer, Chandler Martelli, Moises Lemus, Lexi Mendella, and Alex Deters). James Kabbes earned All Sectional Player, and Ryan Kruger was Honorable Mention All Sectional. Nick Grunloh was 4th pick for All Sectional Goalie.

St.Anthony Bulldogs, as a team, got runner-up for best sportsmanship as a team in the sectional for the whole season. Ryan Kruger broke the record for the most goals scored in a season with 37 goals, which was previously 19 held by Benton Hakman ('14). James Kabbes had 16 assists in season. The Bulldogs had an amazing run & senior leadership was fantastic.


