


High School Enrollment Continues To Grow

#Blessed. How else can we say it? We are truly blessed to be experiencing the highest enrollment numbers at St. Anthony High School in the past ten years! Enrollment is 220 students for the 2017-2018 school year. The highest enrollment in the previous 25 years was 234 students in the 1996-1997 school year.

What is driving our increasing enrollment? Based on conversations with both students and parents, we are proud to say offering both a faith-based education and a rigorous academic program top the list. It is our hope when you enter the school you will notice an obvious focus to create a fun, respectful and academically challenging atmosphere. 
Industrial Arts Award

with 1st place finishes at the Tuscola Invite, Teutopolis Invite, Champaign Invite, Alton Marquette Blastoff, Richland County Invite, Windsor Invite, and the St. Anthony Invite.

They placed 2nd at St. Thomas More Invite and Charleston 9 hole scramble. They won their regional tournament at Effingham Country Club and finished 3rd at sectionals at Spencer T. Olin in Alton.

The girls golf team advanced to the state tournament for the second year in a row and placed 5th out of 12 teams.

This qualified them for their 23rd consecutive sectional appearance.

The team placed 3rd at the Governor's Run Sectional, which qualified them for the IHSA State Finals, where they competed well, finishing 9th overall. The team graduates one senior, Ethan Rozene. His quiet leadership and team first attitude will be greatly missed. Volleyball Coach Cathy Wenthe's volleyball team went 14-18 and went 2-2 in the NTC tournament with Marci Mills and Abby Stock being named to the All-Tournament Team. Marci Mills and Meg Richards made first team All-Conference!

They went on to beat South Central in regional play, but fell to the top seeded Windsor Stew-Stras in the championship match. Good luck to senior Marci Mills!

> Baseball Pitching, defense, and power led the way to a fruitful

21-4 fall baseball season for the Bulldogs, coached by Kenny Koenig. Led by Adam Levitt, Colin Koester, and Dylan Guy on the mound, the team posted a 2.19 ERA with only 2.88 runs per game allowed. The offensive power was led by Blake Niebrugge, Greg Utz, and Joe Kabbes, an astounding 229 runs over 25 games, including 19 homeruns with a .337 team batting average.

Season highlights included a 4-1 season opening win over Teutopolis, regular season NTC Champions, and a 4th consecutive NTC Tournament title, an incredibly rare feat by any NTC team in any sport from any school in the NTC's storied history.
