

Boys Basketball

The 2018-19 St. Anthony Bulldogs Boys' basketball season saw some highs and lows as the Bulldogs learned new roles after losing seven seniors to graduation.

The Bulldogs finished 4th place in the Turkey Tourney with key wins against Tolono Unity on opening night and a two-point win in the annual Black Friday Night game vs. Effingham.

The team finished 2-2 against stiff competition in the Effingham/T-Town Christmas Classic, including a two-point victory vs. Chicago Brooks Academy in OT.

The Bulldogs went undefeated in the NTC conference for the outright conference title, while beating rival Altamont for their 5th NTC Tournament Championship in 6 years.

The regular season came to a close with a 19-10 record,

earning a 2 seed in their own regional. They beat Cumberland in the first round 48-29, setting up a rematch vs. State ranked T-Town. The Bulldogs gave it all they had but fell short in the regional championship game.

The team finished 20-11 for a very successful overall season. This marks the 4th straight year with 20 wins, 4th straight NTC title (shared or outright), and the 3rd straight NTC tourney title. The team is coached by Cody Rincker.


