Boys Golf

In a return to a somewhat normal season, the St.

Anthony Boys Golf Team had a very successful season, winning seven out of twelve 18-hole events, and four out of five 9-hole matches.

In the post season, the team won the school's 22nd IHSA regional title with a score of 296, taking 4 of the 5 individual medals. Junior Jonathan Willenborg claimed medalist honors firing a 70, 2 under par.

At the IHSA sectional, the team placed second by only 1 stroke, qualifying them for their 18th trip to the IHSA state finals.

The Bulldogs finished 4th at State, only 10 strokes out of first

Their season was capped off by finishing third in IHSA state competition.

The team's dual record is 5 wins, 4 losses, 1 tie due to lightning, and 2 rainouts.

The girls participated in six tournaments, placing 3rd out of 16 teams in our St Anthony tournament.

The team placed 4th of 10 in the sectionals, with Emily Kowalke placing second in the IHSA sectional, qualifying her for State.

Emily went 3-2 in state competition placing in the final 17 through 24 at state. Congratulations, Emily.



Volleyball

The volleyball team had a successful 27-10 season. They

finished 3rd at the Olney invitational and followed that up with a 2nd place at the St. Anthony tournament.

The Bulldogs finished 2nd in the NTC regular season schedule and the NTC tournament. At the Mahomet tournament they won bronze flight. The Bulldogs lost to Altamont in the regional semifinals.

Zaccari Inducted Into Illinois Coaches Association Golf Hall of Fame

St. Anthony Boys Golf coach Phil Zaccari has been named a 2021 Inductee to the Illinois Coaches Association Golf Hall of Fame.

Serving as a coach since 1999, his teams have a 297-47 overall varsity match record. His teams have won 38 invitationals, 18 IHSA regional titles and 7 IHSA sectional titles. His teams have made 16 Class 1A State Final appearances, compiling 4 State Championships, 2 second place finishes, and 1 third place finish.

He has been the University of Illinois golf camp staff instructor since 2003. He managed the Pride of the North Side boys and girls golf camps from 2011 to 2017. He was the girls golf coach from 1999 to 2000. Congratulations Coach Zaccari!
