Isabel Moore. Class of 2016

Isabel Moore (Class of 2016) is a research engineer at Lexington, KY-based company, Space Tango.

She currently works on a research project in partnership with the University of Florida on the degeneration of muscle tissue. Moreover, the research is happening in

Space Tango has CubeLabs (shoebox-sized research "labs") delivered to the International Space Station via commercial rockets. Once the astronauts upload the payloads, Space Tango can control everything from Earth. According to Isabel, "We type in all the commands from our office in Lexington, and we can then watch the data live, which can include temperatures, flow rates, or pictures and videos from our cameras and microscopes inside the payloads."

"Physics and math really got me interested in what I am doing today. I took Mr. Poston's physics class my junior year and discovered I liked the part about the circuits. I took physics for two years and got a lot of hands-on experience. The rigors of Mrs. Jones' math class also helped prepare me for college."
